The transparent woman: an approach to the evolution of the female image in modernist stained glass windows in Catalonia

Abstract in English of your presentation (maximum 1,000 characters, in Arial 12 font)

Throughout the history female images have constantly been represented on the stained glass. Most of them have religious iconography as the majority of the preserved buildings containing them are churches. However this would change in the end of the XIX c. with the rise of construction and the revival of decorative arts driven by the emerging bourgeoisie. The stained glass windows would start to decorate new spaces, such as private homes, shops, public institutions, etc. The feminine motifs represented on the windows would have to be adapted to these new locations creating new aesthetic and symbolic models. Female representations would start to reflect the social image of women and its evolution, from the demure woman of the aesthetic historicism to the sensual and voluptuous figures of the Modernism. The glassmakers would use as models both women from different Catalan social classes (the bourgeois, the peasant...) and from repertoires of international publications. "Transparent women" would become numerous and diverse, and start playing major role in the modernist stained glass windows
